

WEEK 6 REPORTS

There was a shock score line in division one as champions JSM B only turned out 2 players at home to Dolcliffe A and despite a Pete Morgan hat trick they paid the price as Neil Rigden and Tony Linggard both beat Stephen Arliss, the pair combined to take the doubles 12-10 in the 5th game to enable Dolcliffe to run out 6-4 winners. Leaders LSM A took advantage of that slip up but needed to win the doubles also in the 5th game to overcome Scorpions A 6-4 with Lance Webster and Mick Brooks both scoring twice but no one could overcome Bradley Wood who scored an excellent and hard earned hat trick.
